POMC memorial cards will be used by National and handed out during speaking engagements or public events, except when inmates are involved. The cards put a face on murder, showing the impact of murder and the aftermath of what murder leaves behind. They will emphasize the often forgotten or overlooked ripple effect murder has on relatives, friends, and the community at large.

If you are interested in participating in National's Memorial Card Program, attached is a Consent Form along with instructions. Once the card is completed, a draft copy will be sent to you for your approval.


Only National will use the cards and the consent forms; however, once you approve the card, a small supply will be sent to you for your own use.

Shannon's engaging smile drew people to her. She was extremely family-oriented and when you became Shannon's friend, you became part of her family. Shannon was 5 months pregnant with her first child, her daughter Alexandra, and she was so thrilled. On September 7, 2001, Shannon and her unborn daughter, Alexandra, were beaten to death with a baseball bat. Shannon's body was removed from her home in a clothing tote and buried in a secluded area off of an Ohio interstate. The murderer, Shannon's husband, was convicted of aggravated murder for both Shannon and Alexandra as well as tampering with evidence. Shannon had been a "silent" victim of domestic violence for more than ten years; and it ultimately cost not only her life but that of her unborn child.
